

FULL FIBRE are failing to comply with the Electronic Communications Code (2003) set by the UK Government to regulate the Telecommunications Network across the Country

The infringements are as listed below :-

Paragraph 3 (4)

“A Code Operator, where practicable, shall share the use of electronic communications apparatus”

We have an existing fibre network installed by GigaClear. Full Fibre have made no attempt to have a dialogue with GigaClear about sharing any apparatus.

Paragraph 3 (5)

“A Code Operator shall install the minimum practical number of items of electronic communications apparatus consistent with the intended provision of electronic communication services and allowing for an estimate of growth in demand for such services”

Full Fibre are proposing to install a duplicate network in addition to the existing GigaClear network.

Paragraph 4 (1)

“A Code Operator shall install all lines underground unless –“

(a) “The line is flown from a pole in an area where service lines are already flown from poles”

We have no existing poles in this area therefore the lines should be installed underground

(e) “It is not in all circumstances reasonably practical to do so”

Gigaclear has proved already that it is possible and practical to lay lines underground in this area

Additional Points

Full Fibre has given the Residents of Lifford Gardens in neighboring Broadway the **option of paying an additional fee to change the installation plans** and put the lines underground rather than overground using poles. The Residents in Willersey have not been offered this choice.

Our **Member of Parliament (Sir Geoffery Clifton-Brown)** has demanded in writing that Full Fibre should not proceed with the scheme in the affected area of Willersey.
